MEMORANDUM OF COUNSEL FOR THE APPLICANT

MAY IT PLEASE THE COURT:

- This memorandum of counsel is filed on behalf of Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency (Waka Kotahi). It follows the pre-hearing conference (PHC) held on Thursday 22 June 2023, and the Court's Minute dated 27 June 2023.
- 2. In its Minute, the Court:
 - (a) directed all parties to "file advice as to the number of witnesses they intend to call" by 30 June 2023";
 - (b) indicated that the Horowhenua District Council chambers could be made available for a hearing beginning on 24 October 2023; and
 - (c) directed Waka Kotahi to provide a propose amended timetable, to work towards a hearing beginning on 24 October 2023.
- 3. Waka Kotahi and its Project Iwi Partners Muaūpoko Tribal Authority and the hapū of Ngāti Raukawa ki te Tonga filed their evidence in chief in respect of these proceedings yesterday. The evidence is available on the Court's website (<u>Ōtaki to North of Levin State Highway Project (O2NL) | Environment</u> Court of New Zealand).
- 4. As discussed at the PHC, in filing its evidence in chief at this early stage, Waka Kotahi is maximising the opportunities for direct discussion between parties and witnesses to resolve or narrow issues. Waka Kotahi will contact all s274 parties directly to discuss the relevant issues and to see if they can be resolved or narrowed and will update the Court on progress in due course.

Identified witnesses

- The Court has provided counsel with emails from the Councils and from s274
 parties advising the Court in respect of witnesses.
- 6. For ease of reference for the Court and the parties, counsel have collated the emails into a table that sets out all identified witnesses (including Waka Kotahi and Project Iwi Partner witnesses) in **Appendix A**.

Expert conferencing

7. Expert conferencing is undertaken in accordance with the Environment Court's Practice Note 2023. To assist in preparing for expert conferencing,

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Appendix B sets out the Waka Kotahi proposed conference dates, times, topics and attendees (using the lists provided in **Appendix A**). Counsel will liaise with the parties and the Court to formalise those dates.

Updated proposed timetable

- 8. Waka Kotahi has carefully considered:
 - (a) the discussions at the PHC in respect of timetabling;
 - (b) the comments provided by the Councils on the previously proposed timetable (and in particular have provided 2 clear weeks from the end of mediation to the date for filing section 274 party evidence and 2 weeks from the filing of the Waka Kotahi rebuttal evidence to the hearing);
 - (c) the number and nature of issues; and
 - (d) the number of witnesses proposed.
- Bearing in mind those discussions, and working towards a hearing beginning on 24 October 2023 as directed by the Court, an updated proposed timetable is attached as **Appendix C**.
- 10. The timeframes for expert witness conferencing and mediation in the updated proposed timetable are based on the availability of Commissioner Buchanan, who counsel understand has been assigned to facilitate both conferencing and mediation. Counsel are considering how mediation might be most efficiently organised, and will report to the Court and the parties in due course.
- 11. Counsel note that the updated proposed timetable includes provision for mediation on cultural matters. Waka Kotahi:
 - (a) is hopeful that cultural mediation is not required but if it is notes that no other parties would need to participate in that mediation;
 - (b) considers it would be appropriate for any mediation to occur separate to the mediation on all other matters; and
 - (c) proposes that counsel report to the Court by Friday 21 July in respect of whether any mediation is required, and what form that might usefully take.

12. Counsel respectfully request that the Court adopts the updated proposed timetable set out in **Appendix C**.
