- Taupo District Council (TDC) wishes to be a party to these proceedings, being ENV-2020-AKL-000095 Mercury NZ Limited v Waikato Regional Council (Appeal).
- 2. TDC made a submission about the subject matter of the Appeal and, as a local authority, has an interest in the Appeal that is greater than the interest that the general public has.
- 3. TDC is not a trade competitor for the purposes of sections 308C and 308CA of the Resource Management Act 1991 (**RMA**).
- 4. TDC is interested in the discrete part of the Appeal that addresses Policy 11 Te Kaupapa Here 11.
- 5. The issue that TDC is interested in is the operation and development of Regionally Significant Industry and Regionally Significant Infrastructure.
- 6. TDC supports the relief sought by the appellant with respect to Policy 11. Plan Change 1 (PC1) must "give effect to" the Waikato Regional Policy Statement (WRPS) as a higher order planning instrument. The WRPS contains broad, enabling, protective provisions in relation to Regionally Significant Infrastructure. PC1 should provide a strong policy direction to enable the development, operation and upgrade of Regionally Significant Infrastructure and should avoid a policy hierarchy that undermines the strong policy support for existing Regionally Significant Infrastructure.

- 7. TDC supports any consequential relief to the extent that it is consistent with the outcomes sought in its appeal.
- 8. TDC agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceedings.
